



## REPORTING TO PARENTS AT STOKE SCHOOL

At Stoke School we want to give every parent a clear picture of where their child is at in all aspects of their schooling.

All children will receive:

**Term 1, Week 9:** students and parents will attend a 12 minute interview with the classroom teacher to set goals for their child to work towards. Information will be shared regarding their achievement and work habits to date.

**Term 3, Week 4:** students and parents will receive a written report stating progress in Oral language, Reading, Writing, Mathematics, Health and Physical Education, Social Sciences, Science, Technology, The Arts, Thinking Skills, Work Habits and a comment about support you could provide at home. This report will indicate progress towards the National Standards in Reading, Writing and Mathematics but is not the summative assessment as that can only be done after 1,2 and 3 whole years at school and then at the conclusion of Years 4, 5 and 6.

**Term 4: Week 9:** Year 4, 5 and 6 children will receive their National Standards Achievement Certificate. All children across the school will receive their next year's class placement and stationery list.

**Throughout the Year:** Within 3 weeks of a Year 1-3 students birthday a National Standards Achievement Certificate will be sent home and parents will be invited to come in to discuss progress after their child's first, second and third year at school.

The last day for reporting is the 7<sup>th</sup> December 2012, if your child has their birthday after this date they will get a National Standard Achievement Certificate within 3 weeks of starting school in the following year. It will take 3 weeks as the new teacher will need to assess your child and consolidate information with the previous year's teacher (keeping in mind the fallback over summer).
